Impact	<p>We value “bang for your buck.” Can you see or feel the level of impact being made?</p> <p>Clear impact ex) there is a clear before or after picture of what was done. Fulfilling, important, necessary, good use of time.</p> <p>Unclear impact – “Did that even make a difference?”</p> <p>Is there “kingdom impact?” <b>Key verse</b> - John 15:8 <i>This is to my Father’s glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.</i></p>
Relational	Are there opportunities to build relationships with the people or the organization we are serving? Is there an existing relationship?
Unskilled vs Skilled	Unskilled = planting, mulch, weed abatement, painting, Skilled = Irrigation, plumbing, roofing, electrical
Volunteer Experience	Culmination of factors including impact, ease, order, and cost
